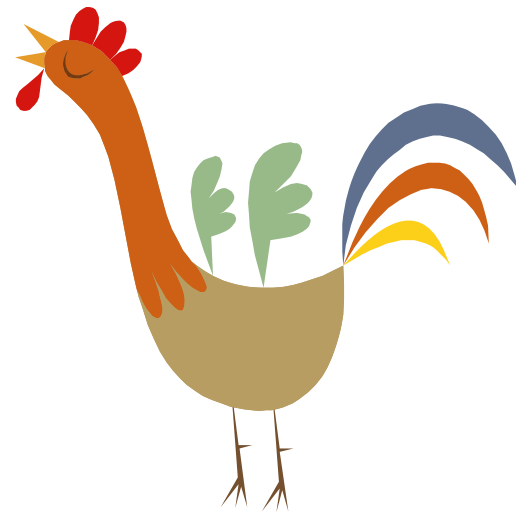

educational philosophy

We believe there has to be a balance between teaching skills and fostering creativity. We also believe the learning experience needs to be engaging and fun so the young learner is busy and enjoys this vital discovery process. This, to us, is authentic learning.

We seek to help children uncover their unique strengths and we, then, encourage those special gifts to blossom.

Jenny has a tremendous love for learning and exploration. Her inquisitiveness, positive outlook and enthusiasm for life are naturally infused in her teaching style. Through her experience and training, Jenny has become an expert in integrating education into real life experiences.

a little bit about our program...

At busy bre's farm, we integrate fun and learning.



The children, who are part of our playschool, interact with the farm. Their learning is incorporated into daily life on the farm. They play and are taught using their local environment - the barnyard, the animals and the garden.

Literacy Skill Development - We use the Balanced Literacy framework to foster our students' reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. This educational model is a comprehensive approach to learning to read and write. Educational and social skills are frequently integrated so each child receives ample exposure and practice in the vital basics of literacy. Three- and four-year old children are most often at what is called the Pre-Emergent and Emergent levels of learning. This means that their interest in learning to read and write is just beginning to surface. As such, we focus on activities that peak their interest and strengthen their skills. Some of the skill sets we work on include (but are not limited to) developing the ability to focus attention, using pictures to convey ideas, communicating these ideas using simple phrases, beginning to identify sound and letter relationships, using illustrations and print to predict what will come next in a story, and recognizing some familiar and some sight words.

Integrated Learning - At busy bre's, we work with weekly themes. Some examples of themes are flowers, farm animals, bugs, fruits and vegetables, jobs, and counting. Since the most effective way to encourage learning is to make it unnoticeable, hidden within fun, every day, real life moments, we construct our thematic learning units into fun, hands-on activities on the farm.

Social Skill Development - An important aspect of child development at this age is learning appropriate social skills for Kindergarten. At busy bre's our students are taught to share, take turns, listen attentively, raise their hands, respect each other's space, and play cooperatively.

Physical Skill Development - We incorporate activities that help to develop the whole child so that their language, fine motor and gross motor skills are nurtured too.

Play Time - Our little farmers spend significant time each day playing. This age group learns important social and physical skills through exploration and play. Play time (relaxation) is a vital part of life on the farm.
